DROP/ADD POLICY

The drop period is the first 20th to 25th day of the course (about the 4th week of school).

If you need to make a course request change, please make it **BEFORE June 30**. No classes may be added after the school year begins. Only students who do not have a study hall may drop a class during the drop period. To drop a course after June 30th students must wait until the drop period which is the 20th to 25th day of the semester or before 2nd semester begins. Students will not be dropped from a class prior to that time. After day 20 the student must talk with their counselor and get a "Request to Drop a Class" form to complete and return. **Students dropping a class during days 20 to 25 will be rescheduled into an academic study hall only, with no penalty.** Requests to drop a course after day 25 of the semester must be approved by an administrator. If the request is granted the drop will be considered a failure and an "F" will be recorded on the transcript and calculated with rank and GPA. There will be no further schedule changes except for individual circumstances such as students needing to meet graduation requirements or meeting competencies.

To Add A Course Second Semester: Requests for adding courses will be considered one week prior to second semester. Students should make an appointment with their guidance counselor during the first semester exam week to explore options and course offerings. Second semester classes can not be added after the semester begins.
